(iii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG Courses; and
(iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
6. This permission to increase admission capacity from 80 to 100 seats in existing UG (BAMS) course and open 02 new PG courses as mentioned above, for the first admitted batch of 2018-19 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against the course/s appear for the first final examination of the said course/s and at that time, the college authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.
7. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers, as prescribed in the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the students in the abovementioned UG and PG course/s is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.
8. The fulfillment of the conditions attached to the permission given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted to the Ministry of AYUSH endorsing a copy to the CCIM also. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2019-20.
